Dear Corona del Sol Parents & Guardians:

We would like to provide you with the following updated information regarding the Corona del Sol air quality issue:

Removal of carpet from classrooms:

It is our goal that double layers of carpeting will be completely removed by the time school starts on August 4, 2008. Work will begin at the end of the school year in May.

Phase I Scope: Central Plant:

It is anticipated this phase will be completed within the next two weeks. The work areas have not impacted students or staff.

Phase II Scope: Main Piping Loop Installation & "E" Building Exhaust Fan Installation:

This work includes installing the main chilled water and heating water piping systems all around the campus. It also includes installing new exhaust fans in the first and second levels of building "E" which will help insure CO<sub>2</sub> removal during daily school activities.

This work has begun and should be complete by the time school starts in August. This work has been scheduled so that students and staff will not be impacted.

Construction Plans:

Construction fencing was installed on Monday, April 28; work areas are clearly delineated to keep students away from these areas. After school was dismissed on Tuesday, April 29, the contractor began removing the tectum panels from the canopy areas.

Each subcontractor has been notified that all work is to be scheduled from 2:00 PM to 10:30 PM. Deliveries and planning will take place during the school day, but this should not affect any student activities. All deliveries will be coordinated through site administration to ensure little or no disruption to the educational process.

After Health Effects Group has reviewed the mechanical drawings, the final location of 22 CO<sub>2</sub> sensors in "E" wing will be confirmed. The CO<sub>2</sub> sensors, as well as the exhaust fans in "E" wing, will be installed during the summer.

Legislation:

We continue to be optimistic that legislation will be passed which will provide financial assistance to complete Phase IV. (This includes installing air conditioning units to each classroom.)

Other Financial Sources:

At the May 7, 2008, Governing Board meeting, the Citizens High School Financial Advisory Committee will recommend the Governing Board call for a Class B Bond to be included in the November 2008 General Election which would fund the HVAC system at Corona.

Testing:

In April Prime Consulting, Inc. tested for asbestos/mold and mold in practice booths. Test results will soon be available on the District's website ([www.tuhsd.k12.az.us](http://www.tuhsd.k12.az.us)).
